Dear Prime Minister,

I have no doubt that the Basin Plan is not what arguably the country's greatest Prime Minister John Howard envisaged when he introduced the Water Act in 2007 (although I do not have the same faith in the then Water Minister Malcolm Turnbull's agenda).

You have had us all believe that you are a leader of the common people, that you are a leader who will ensure that those who work hard will be rewarded. You have lead us believe that those who dream and strive will be treated fairly. What is happening in southern NSW and northern Victoria is un-Australian, and now it is unfolding on your watch.

For reasons we cannot understand he has abandoned the Southern Basin communities of central and northern Victoria, and southern NSW.
